



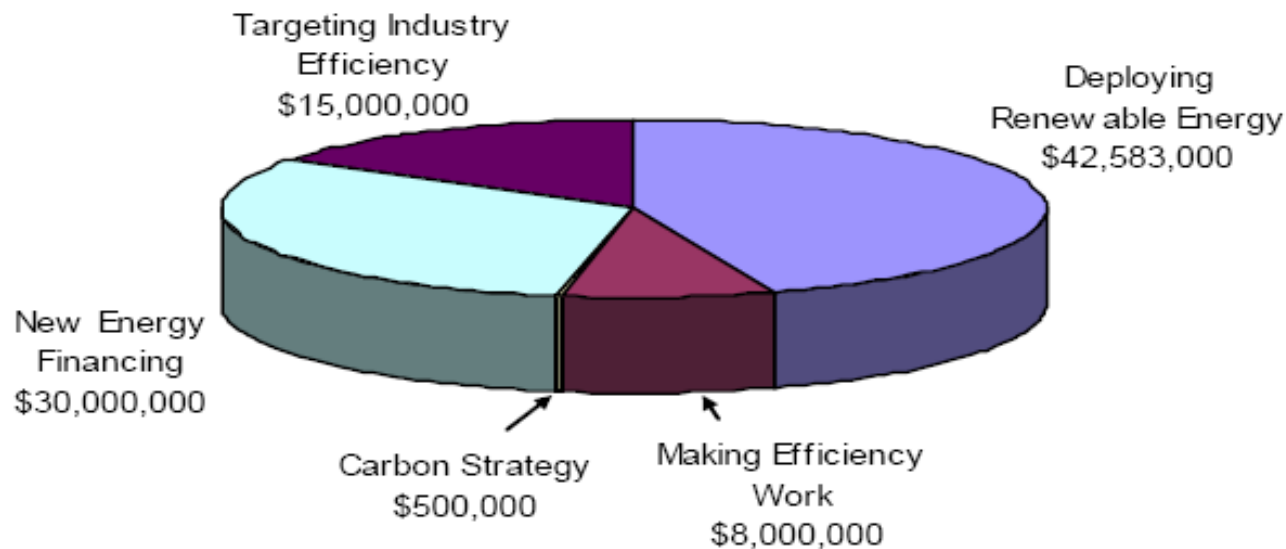
American Recovery and Reinvestment Act

Energy related funding allocated to State of Ohio:

- State Energy Plan - \$96 million
- Energy Efficiency & Conservation Block Grants – \$84 million
- ENERGY STAR Rebate Program - \$11 million
- Enhancing State Government Energy Assurance Capabilities and Planning for Smart Grid Resiliency - \$1.2 million
- National Clean Diesel Funding Assistance Program - \$4.9 million

- **State Energy Plan - \$96,083,000**
(administered by the Ohio Department of Development's Energy Office)

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act State Energy Plan

- **Solar and Wind Deployment Systems- RFP #09-08**
Closed: September 25, 2009
- **Targeting Industry Efficiency – RFP #09-10**
Closed: October 16, 2009
- **All applications are being evaluated through a competitive process. Awards will be announced in next few weeks.**
- **Additional solicitations will be released in coming weeks, according to the approved State Energy Plan.**

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Energy Efficiency & Conservation Block Grant

Total Available: \$84,183,300

- **\$59,203,700**
(direct allocation from the federal government to the ten largest counties and to the thirty-three largest cities)
- **\$24,979,600 – Administered by State of Ohio**
 - **60.05 percent - \$15,000,000**
(for local county & city governments that did not receive a direct allocation)
 - RFP Deadline: November 30, 2009
 - **32.83 percent or \$8,200,000**
(for state facilities and institutions of higher education)
 - **\$ 7.12 percent or \$1,779,600**
(outreach, technical assistance, third-party reviews, and reporting)
